Canvasback Missions is a non-profit, Christian, humanitarian organization that was founded in 1981 by Jamie and Jacque Spence to serve remote Pacific Islands with the needed health care and health education. In the mid 1970's, Jamie and Jacque Spence gave up their professional careers and sailed the Pacific for seven years. Looking to the islands as their personal playground, instead they discovered a great deal of misery and yet found people who knew

EYEsee was founded by a group of juniors and seniors from Saint Viator High School in the summer of 2008. Undeterred by their lack of financial resources, they decided to reach out to the world's poor in order to alleviate some of their poverty. EYEsee is committed to helping the world's poor experience corrected vision with recycled eyeglasses.

(...continued from page 1) and equipment to island hospitals, Canvasback brings specialty teams on overseas missions to provide island inhabitants with medical training, consultations, and surgeries. Canvasback also educates indigents on disease prevention, with a special focus on diabetes reversal as diabetes is the number one cause of death and the number one reason for hospital admission in the Marshall Islands.

Canvasback's specialties include ophthalmology, orthopedics, E.N.T., OB/GYN, and urology; and the organization has coordinated specialty teams in cataract, retinopathy, orthopedic, and ENT surgery for their diabetes reversal program.

Canvasback has given more than \$9.5 million in medical and dental services, health education, and relief supplies to islanders. Much of the supplies and equipment Canvasback uses and more than 200 of these volunteers assist in overseas missions.

Canvasback Missions has a

provides to the islands is donated by big-hearted businesses. Aside from a small staff, Canvasback is run entirely by volunteers, and high need for eyeglasses because Pacific Islanders face the major public health problem of cataracts from extreme sun exposure and the deteriorating eyesight that comes as a side effect of the high rates in diabetes. They have asked for EYEsee's help in meeting their current need for eyeglasses for their missions.

Jamie Spence has also extended an invitation to EYEsee members to join their organization on their overseas missions. This is a service opportunity that many Christian students take part in as a character-building trip. EYEsee looks forward to taking part in these mission trips in the future.

EYEsee is very proud to be associated with Canvasback Missions and to partner with them in their mission of bringing healing and hope to the poor in the Pacific Islands.
